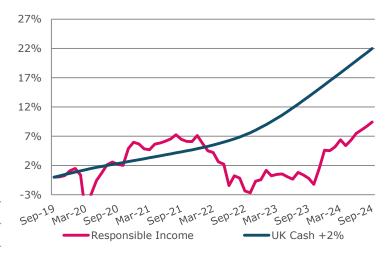

Quarterly Commentary

Bonds rallied on renewed anticipation of interest rate cuts, and defensive market segments – especially those seen as 'bond proxies', such as utilities – also outperformed. US 10-year Treasuries gained 3.9%, as yields declined on softening US economic data and in anticipation of Fed monetary easing. The Bloomberg Global Aggregate index, a broader measure of fixed income, rose 7.0%, albeit this equates to a much more modest 0.8% in sterling terms.

Over the third quarter the strategy gained 1.8%, taking year-to-date returns to 4.6%. Key contributors over the period included PIMCO GIS Capital Securities, which gained 5.0%, and Vontobel TwentyFour Strategic Income, up 4.0% – both benefitting from further strength in bank financials. Another strong performer was Aegon Global Diversified Income, which rose 4.0%. Only two funds were negative contributors in Q3; Baillie Gifford Worldwide Responsible Global Dividend, which lost 4.3%, and Fiera Emerging Markets, which was down 3.6% but remains a very strong performer on the year, up over 11%.

Trading included trimming and subsequently exiting the aforementioned Baillie Gifford fund, feeling the fund's quality-growth universe was fully valued. In terms of purchases, we added to existing positions in Royal London Short Duration Global High Yield and Pictet Strategic Credit, and allocated to Latitude Horizon (see Featured Fund) and Ruffer Diversified Return International. In short, we slightly reduced our equity beta, marginally extended our duration, and increased our diversification via two well-proven multi-asset strategies.

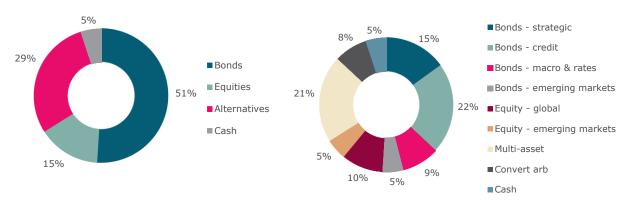

Featured Fund

Latitude Horizon: is a balanced multi-asset fund with a very simple objective, which is to target long-term returns equal or better than inflation +4%. Latitude's philosophy is that a simple and consistent long-term strategy is the single most important feature of an investment process. PM Freddie Lait spent considerable time designing the approach to be as simple and effective as possible, while avoiding superfluous complexity or cost. The result is that Latitude manage only one core strategy for all clients, aiming simply to protect capital and to increase the real purchasing power for investors ahead of inflation. This objective is achieved by following a rigorous and well-defined process, investing consistently throughout market cycles, and avoiding excessive concentration risk.

On the equity side of the book, the fund holds a diversified portfolio of high-quality businesses, wherever possible in industries with structural tailwinds, maintaining a strong discipline around valuation. The other half of the fund is comprised of non-equity investments which the team believe can efficiently reduce risk while generating incremental returns. This is currently made up of a mixture of short-dated government bonds (mostly UK and US), longer-dated inflation-linked bonds, and cash, and at other times may include precious metals exposure. The outcome of the approach has been a steady, consistent track record, with only modest drawdowns in the pandemic period and 2022 bear market.



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
